Two lucky Hyde Clarendon College students got the chance to shadow Ashton-under-Lyne Police Officers, to understand more about the profession and to help them with their Public Services course.

Sophie Turner and Natasha Cooke took part in a number of activities around the Tameside area to understand how the police work in the local community. At the start of the week they were introduced to Chief Superintendent Hamilton, who gave a presentation of policing in the area and asked them about their views of the police and of crime in Tameside.

The learners also received first hand experience of working with the police, as



they visited the Operational Communications Unit, where the police handle all the calls and activity for the region. The Crime Scene Investigations Unit team also took their fingerprints and showed them the technology needed to find and decode evidence at crime scenes. Sophie and Natasha shadowed student Police Officers when they visited cultural community centres, a Mosque and a Sikh temple.

Education Maintenance Allowance

EMA is dependant on your household income. If your household income is less than £30,000 combined, then you could be entitled to EMA. You could receive £10, £20 or even £30 a week, plus bonuses every couple of months!
